Saturday Sailing/Winter Series

Please note that we have reduced the number of races to count towards the series to nine, with two discards, so that they do not clash with events like the AYC High Tide series etc. On days where there is a conflict with other events we propose Saturday Sailing will still take place, with the usual rum prizes, but not be part of the Series.

Sat Dec 6th is the start of a long weekend (Heroes Day Monday 8th– public holiday- also full moon). A **pursuit race** starting at the Club line and finishing in Falmouth Harbour is proposed. Anchor/alongside at AYC, drinks & dinner at Club Sushi to thank Angie for her support of our regatta. Jolly Harbour Yacht Club Annual Regatta Nov 22 & 23

Fifteen yachts took part in our Club Annual Regatta last Saturday and Sunday. Winds varied from a pleasant 12-14 knots to the occasional line squall with in excess of 30 Knots! Seven races were completed, six counted to the final results.

Saturday's conditions suited **Tanner Jones and Blue Peter**, with four firsts in four races. The next two places were taken in various order by **Elethea** (Rick Gormley), **Frolic** (Hans Lammers), **Cricket** (Sandy Mair), & **Taz** (Bernie Wong) showing the closeness of the racing in this Division. **Digicell Spirit** (National Sailing Academy) showed great spirit in hanging on to these leaders despite their penal handicap, but the schoolboys on **Digicell Valiant** (All Saints School) had a tough time in their first ever Regatta, losing a halyard in one race, and blowing out their spinnaker in a spectacular broach in another. Day two had more varied gusty conditions, **Elethea** managed two wins to break **Blue Peter's** dominance, and **Digicell Spirit** got a creditable second in testing conditions in the second race. Blue Peter won overall, and was voted best yacht in the regatta, Elethea was second, and Frolic third.

Division two was dominated by the giant Jenneau 44 **ChiliChili** (Tim Richards) who led the fleet around the wrong marks in race one, won by **Volare**,(Terry Allen), but thereafter was only beaten by **Yesss** (Commodore) in the very strong wind of race two on Sunday when she reefed. Really close racing between **Full Monty** (Grahame Williams), **Volare** and **Yesss** left the Commodore (**Yesss**) second overall in the division by one point, with **Volare** and **Full Monty** with equal points next. The result of the last race secured the third prize for **Full Monty**.

Prizes from first to fourth place in each division were graciously presented by former Governor-General of Antigua & Barbuda, **Sir James Carlisle GCMG**, who had praise and encouragement for the young sailors from the National Sailing Academy (4th Div one), as well as amusing anecdotes about the SNP!
