



HANSA International Antigua Championship February 26th 2019. National Sailing Academy.

NOTICE OF RACE

1. ENTRY

- 2.1 Entry is open to the following sailors.
 - a) Sailability Doubles Division, at least one of the crew identifies as having a disability
 - b) Inter Schools Doubles Division, at least one crew member must be from a local school.
 - c) Open Single Person International Division, open to anyone.
- 2.2 To enter, be at the venue at 9am at the 26th, or as early as possible before the division start you wish to enter. Enter at the entry desk under the Marquee. First come first served.
- 2.3. Hansa 303 class will be sailed.

2. DIVISIONS

- Division 1 Two person Sailability
- Division 2 Two person Schools
- Division 3 One person International Open

3. FEES

- 3.1 Entry is free of charge.

4. CALENDAR

- 4.1 Saturday January 26th 2019 National Sailing Academy, Antigua
 - a) Registration 9am to 10am
 - b) Briefing 10am
 - c) Racing Div 1 & 2 11am
 - d) Racing Div 3 13.30Each division will sail **3 races.**

5. RULES

5.1 The regatta will follow The International Sailing Federation's Racing Rules of Sailing. Some rules will be changed.

Rule 33 The course will not be changed after the preparatory signal.

Rule 41 Sailors can get help from safety boats and committee boats. They can only be given help with direction, reefing, bailing, and towed off a shoal when run aground.

Rule 44.1 The Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

Rule 61.1(a) Sailors do not need to hail "Protest" or fly a red flag but they should if they can.

Rule 63.3(a) Sailors can bring in a support person to help them in a protest. The support person can help through the whole process.

5.2 If changes to the rules are required they will be posted on the notice board. No further sailing instructions will be issued.

5.3 The Hansa class association membership rule will not be used (rule 87, rule C.6).

5.4 English is the language of this .regatta. The English World Sailing rules will be used.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailors will see the sailing instructions when applicable posted on the notice board.

7. THE COURSES

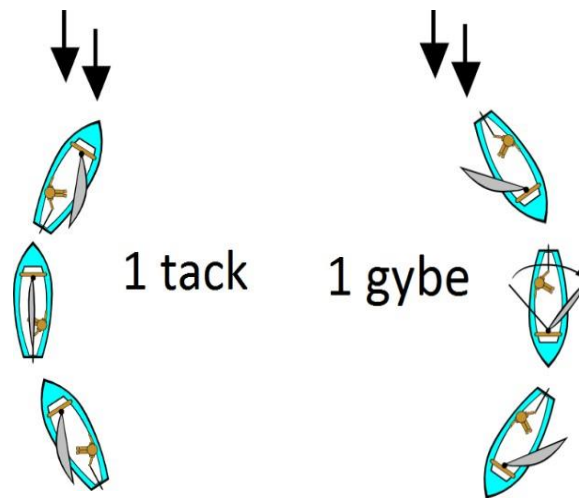
Boats will sail a Triangle or Windward-Leeward course and will be advised at the sailors briefing.

8. SCORING

Each Division will sail 3 races. There will be no discards.

9. PENALTIES

On-water penalties will be one turn penalties. This changes rule 44.1.



10. SUPPORT BOATS

Support boat drivers must sign on at registration.

11. TAKING BOATS OUT OF THE WATER

Boats may be removed from the water during the event.

12. PRIZES

12.1 Division 1 Doubles Sailability. 1st , 2nd , 3rd

12.2 Division 2 Doubles Schools. 1st , 2nd , 3rd

12.3 Division 3 Singles Open. 1st , 2nd , 3rd

12.4 Other prizes might also be awarded.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. This is in The Racing Rules of Sailing, rule 4. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

14. MEDIA

The organizers and sponsors might take photographs and videos of the sailors. Sailors give permission for these to be used with no restrictions.
